
"Japan's Actions against Piracy off the Coast of Somalia and in the Gulf of Aden"

Japan has engaged in counter piracy off the coast of Somalia and in the Gulf of Aden in cooperation with international community including dispatching the Japan Self-Defense Forces (JSDF) and the Japan Coast Guard(JCG)*. Piracy incidents, Japan's actions and its achievements in 2015 are as follows. *Members of the JCG are on board of the JSDF's destroyers.

Piracy Incidents

According to the ICC-IMB*, no Somali piracy incidents were reported in 2015.

Although a marked reduction has been seen in the number of attacks and hijackings in 2012, Japan observes that the underlying causes of piracy remain in place, and the current decline is inherently reversible.


The Counter-Piracy Operation by the Japan Self-Defense Forces(JSDF) and the Japan Coast Guard(JCG)

In June 2009, Japan enacted the "Anti-Piracy Measures Act". In July 2009, the **JSDF** commenced escort warning/surveillance activities off the coast of Somalia and in the Gulf of Aden as the Counter-Piracy Operation under the Act.

Act on Special Measures Concerning the Guarding of Japanese Ships in **Pirate-Infested Waters**



Under the Act, privately contracted security personnel who are confirmed by the Minister of Land Transportation Infrastructure, Tourism of Japan can guard Japanese flag vessels in the Pirate-Infested Waters.
